Baby Bottle Campaign - Begins Sunday, May 13



Remember filling baby bottles with coins, bills, or checks in the weeks between, and including, Mother's Day and Father's Day?

We are pleased to announce that our congregation will again be partnering with churches from Antrim and Charlevoix Counties in a Baby Bottle Campaign for the <u>Moms &</u> <u>Tots Center</u> and <u>His House</u> (a ministry for men) in Ellsworth. These are ministries of

Outreach Ministry Team Tours Moms and Tots and His House in Ellsworth

On May 8, four members of Outreach drove out to Ellsworth to meet with Gayle Koon and Stacey Nelson, co-directors of a ministry that Gayle started 17 years ago. This warm and friendly house has several counseling rooms, a kitchen for cooking classes, a playroom and storage for baby clothes, diapers and baby equipment. Young families, from an initial pregnancy test to children of five years old, can receive counseling, love and support and nursery supplies.

Stacy, a former minister with a big heart, introduced us to the new addition that is called "His House." Everything about this addition was masculine; the paint colors, the grill on the deck and the well equipped tool shop. Stacy told us that when fathers come in with a family, he leaves the kids and mother with Gayle and he starts a conversation with the man by suggesting they go off and cook a hamburger on the grill, shows him the tool shop or sometimes even takes them fishing. In this manner Stacy engages them in conversation. It is one of the only facilities in the State that address the problems facing a young father who may be unemployed or not having the background for fathering.

The other side of the house holds the "Moms and Tots" program. It has a library of instructional videos on many subjects designed to prepare for parenting. Parents can review a video and earn points towards a new crib, car seat, stroller or other equipment for babies and children. They call this "Earn While You Learn." There are also a variety of other programs available for both parents. Children are cared for by volunteers in a well stocked, comfy area with toys, books, snacks and rocking chairs. Baby clothes, donated by the community, are free as are diapers.

Our church supports this Christian based facility through Outreach but also through the Baby Bottle Campaign which will begin on Mother's Day and continues through Father's Day, ending on June 17. Be sure to pick up one of these baby bottles. Our support, along with churches and community groups from around the area, keep this mission going.
