Outreach Collecting Donations for Patriot Place

Outreach Ministry Team is asking for donations to go to Patriot Place during the month of October. Patriot Place is Northern Michigan's only Veterans Housing Community for male veterans who are experiencing homelessness due to post traumatic



stress, substance abuse or mental health concerns. It is located in Gaylord. Unlike a temporary emergency shelter, veterans in need will have the opportunity to live independently with support services for up to two years.

Patriot Place is a transitional living community that consists of four duplex housing units. Twenty-four veterans (at any given time) can be housed. The goal is for the veterans to increase their strengths and income through life skills classes, employment and assistance in receiving benefits.

Don Reynolds collected the donations from our congregation for Patriot Place last year and delivered them by Veteran's Day. He is going to do the same thing this year.

Two organizations from our church are joining forces to present a guest speaker from Rwanda - Rev. Bizimana. The Outreach committee along with Presbyterian Women would like to invite you on Thursday, October 11 to join us for a presentation from this esteemed speaker. The time is 7:00 P.M. in the Fellowship Hall.

Rev. Bizimana has some powerful stories of reconciliation to tell about his work in peace building in Rwanda after the genocide years. The fact that he has been invited back for a second visit as an International Peacemaker is a good indication that he was well received the first visit in 2015. The Presbyterian Church in Rwanda is the partner church for PC(USA)'s ministry in Rwanda. Rev. Bizimana is the President of Remera Presbytery.

On a personal note, I remember the internal strife and massacres in Rwanda and am looking forward to hearing first hand the efforts being made to reconcile the various religious and cultural differences among the people of Rwanda. He states in his bio, "Survivors share reconciliation groups with Perpetrators who killed their families. You will be surprised to see them sitting together helping one another. We have trained Peacemakers in the High School. These are the pillars of the peace and reconciliation seed which is to be planted in the next generation."

Come join us to learn of one of the improvements being made in our vast world. We thank God for these dedicated individuals. We can be inspired by such people. Refreshments (of course) will be available.
