Christian Education & Youth Update

The 2018/2019 school year was another great one in the area of family ministry at the First Presbyterian Church of Elk Rapids. Our children's Sunday School continues to grow



with both new students and new teachers. Our youth group continued to volunteer throughout the school year with various organizations, hosted community youth events, attended overnighters, winter camp, and completed a confirmation class bringing four students into membership. Looking forward there is so much taking place in the area of family ministry in our church over the summer months.

For the second year in a row our church hosted a high school Graduation Party for a student in need. This was a joint endeavor with multiple ministry teams, various members of the congregation, and even members of Sacred Heart Catholic Church coming together to share the love of Jesus. The family was so appreciative that the

church was willing to help them and they want to thank all of you. I truly view this as us being the body of Christ, 1 Corinthians 12:27, and I am so thankful that this church continues to make things like this happen.

On June 13-16 we are taking part in our first ever church-wide Family Mission Trip. This is an amazing opportunity for our congregation to come alongside a small struggling church in the Upper Peninsula and help them. We have 7 families planning to take part in this trip and I believe it's going to be an incredible weekend for each of them.

Our fifth annual Youth Mission Week will be taking place in conjunction with Vacation Bible School June 24-28. In addition to ministering to more than 100 children through our VBS program, our youth will be partnering with ministry organizations around the area. We will be working with both Food Rescue of Northern Michigan as well as Freedom Builders. We will also be working with Safe Harbor to provide for some of the basic needs of the homeless community here in our region. This year we will have the youth group from Epic Community Church of Portland, Michigan joining us. I am looking forward to seeing what God has for our children, youth, and church during this amazing week.

The first weekend of August our church has been asked to help with Harbor Days. We are looking for volunteers to help with children's day at Memorial Park. This will involve manning various games and activities to ensure that children are safe. As we all know Harbor Days is the largest event in our community and this is one way our church can help with this event. Additionally we will be hosting our annual breakfast on August 4 for the community volunteers who cleanup after Harbor Days. This breakfast provides a gathering place for the Harbor Days committee and the volunteer cleanup team; it has become a regular part of how we support our community.

The weekend of August 9-11 we will be enjoying for first ever church wide Family Camping Trip. This will involve camping, canoeing, and worship around a campfire.
